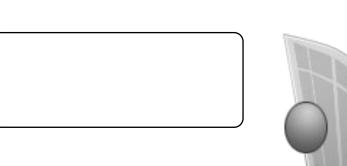

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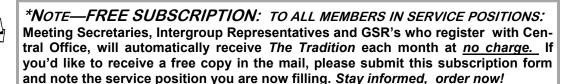

Monday morning and the alarm goes off – time to go to work. Rolling out of bed a wave of nausea passes through your body. You rush to the bathroom, turn on the shower and try to throw-up quietly so your wife and kids won't hear you. You start to shake and sweat runs down your cheek. All you can think about is taking a drink. Not again! Not today! Tears swell in your eyes.

Struggling to put down a few pieces of toast you don't know if it's going to stay down. Trying to remember what you did the night before, all you can think about is taking a drink. Concentrate damn it! It's time to be a dad – your son needs to go to preschool. You struggle to get him in his car seat and you tell yourself you can make it until the end of the day, but there you are locking him in the car as you run into the liquor store. The thoughts run through your mind "He's too young, he won't notice, he won't remember, it's just an airplane bottle, can't be caught driving drunk with vour child in the car, child endangerment, I can't do it, I won't do it, I HAVE TO DO IT..." and then you do it. As the combination of 100 proof vodka and orange juice flows down your throat you try not to throw it back up. Waiting until it settles, you continue you on and drop him off - hoping the teacher once again doesn't smell the booze on your breath.

Before slipping into work you pull over and throw-up on the side of the road – so much for your relief. You repeat to vourself "NO MORE ALCO-HOL!" You see your friends that you partied with the night before and they all seem fine. You wonder why you're different. How could they drink like you did and not feel like you feel? By lunch you're planning on how to skip out of work early so you can find the relief vou need.

Racing out of work you head straight to the liquor store. No need for a mixer you raise the bottle to your lips. Relief comes instantly. You drink to relieve the pain. You drink to relieve the cravings. You promised yourself you wouldn't drink and here you are again. Day after day you face this battle. The alcohol always wins. In light of all of the negative consequences; in light of the physical discomfort and the sincere desire to stop vou drink.

This is the insanity of alcoholism. This the insanity that the steps relieve.

**Q:** How many sponsors does it take to screw in a lightbulb?

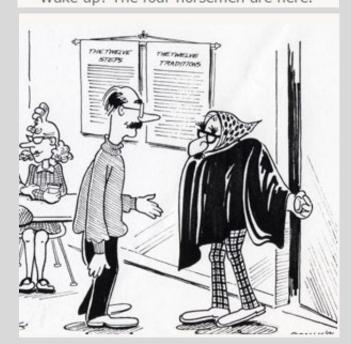

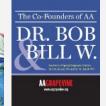

"For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority — a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern."

- Do I criticize or do I trust and support my group officers, AA committees, and office workers? Newcomers? Old-timers?
- 2. Am I absolutely trustworthy, even in secret, with the AA Twelfth Step jobs or other AA responsibilities?
- 3. Do I look for credit in my AA jobs? Praise for my AA ideas?
- 4. Do I have to save face in group discussion, or can I yield in good spirit to the group conscience and work cheerfully along with it?
- 5. Although I have been sober for a few years, am I still willing to serve my turn at AA chores?
- 6. In group discussions, do I sound off about matters on which I have no experience and little knowledge?

# Living Step # 2

# "Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity."

The moment they read Step two, most A.A. newcomers are confronted with a dilemma, sometimes a serious one. How often have we heard them cry out, "Look what you people have done to us! You have convinced us that we are alcoholics and that are lives are unmanageable. Having reduced us to a state of absolute helplessness, you now declare that none but a Higher Power can remove our obsession. Some of us won't believe in God, others can't, and still others who do believe that God exists have no faith whatever He will perform this miracle. Yes, you have us over the barrel, all right ... but where do we go from here.

Therefore, Step two is the rallying point for all of us. Whether agnostic, atheist, or former believer, we can stand together on this Step. True humility and an open mind can lead us to faith, and every A.A. meeting is an assurance that God will restore us to sanity if we rightly relate ourselves to Him.

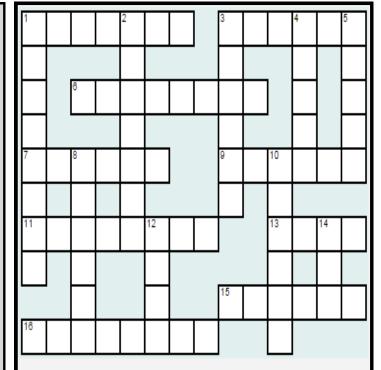
